### The Daily Office:

We are creatures of time, and time is the arena of God's self-revelation. Paul says to the Galatians, "..when the appointed time came, God sent his Son." [4:4] God's self-revelation is disclosed in the rhythm of life: as light turns to darkness and to the light again; as sleep gives way to waking, and waking to work; and as work returns to reflection and rest again.

There is chronological time, when, as the poet says, "time turns round itself in an obedient circle." This is mechanical time, timetable time, time where the light of the Presence is not perceived:

"The heavens declare the glory of God,

The vault of heaven declares God's handiwork:

Day discourses to day,

Night to night hands on knowledge.

No utterance at all, no speech,

*No sound that anyone can hear;* 

Yet their voice goes out through all the earth,

And their message to the ends of the world." ~Ps. 19:1-14

There is also kairotic time, or sacred time. But in truth, as time is part of God's good creation, it might be argued that time is never actually "kronos," but always "kairos." Faith has always perceived this, and Christian communities have always labored to "redeem the time," or, to place an overlay of intentionality upon time. It is within this overlay that the Created perceives its oneness with its Creator.

Part of this legacy is the Christian Year, which stretches from Advent through Epiphany, from Ash Wednesday to Good Friday, and from Easter through Pentecost. Another aspect of this legacy is the Canonical Hours, observed by monastic communities the world over. Within this structure is to be found the peaceful alteration of work and rest, and the challenge to stay awake with Christ in Gethsemane.

By the Third Century, the structure of the Canonical Hours had been established, whether from the hours of prayer in the synagogue, or derived from the Roman division of the day into four "hours"—Prima [First]; Tertia [Third]; Sexta [Sixth]; and Nona [Ninth]. The four watches of the night were also incorporated into this structure: the first watch [Vespers, from Lat. "Evenings"]; the second, at midnight [Compline, from Lat. "Complete"]; the third, at cockcrow, became Matins, after Matuta, the goddess of the morning; and the fourth, at dawn, became Lauds, from Lat. "Laudare" or, to praise or extol.

The Canonical Hours have always been corporate. As <u>Praise God: The Common Prayer at Taize</u>, expresses it, "Common prayer is a different exercise from the more-or-less silent waiting on God in our rooms with the door shut, which we are inclined to consider as the main form of praying."

Benedict, in his "Rule" wrote that he believed that the unceasing praise of God was the chief purpose of the Church. Evelyn Underhill confirms this, saying that the Canonical Hours is the ordained form within which the whole Church performs unceasing praise from hour to hour, night and day.

The Hours have another function as well. Brother Roger of Taize believed that perseverance is the way to focus our attention upon Christ through all the dull days of our life. In other words, we must knock at the door until it opens, for sometimes, the Light of the Presence can flash through our prayer, and there are no words that can describe this experience.

In this version of the Hours, we have divided four twenty-four hours days into eight three-hour segments that correspond to the traditional canon. In this version we lift-up eight "Holy Mysteries" which are: [1] The Eucharist; [2] Gethsemane; [3] The Absence of God; [4] the Resurrection; [5] Pentecost; [6] Epiphany; [7] The Baptism of out Lord; and [8] the Transfiguration. The version observes the entire Christian Year in four days, whereas in a monastic setting, the cycle takes-up the whole calendar year.

Observing the Hours helps us to perceive the sacred nature of time, and to see our own life, as well as our life together, with a greater clarity, and as part of the Light of God revealed in time.

#### How to use this booklet:

For stay-at-home meditation, we don't recommend observing the entire four-day cycle at one time. One "Day" in the cycle can be completed over a couple of days as time permits, or you can choose a day, and do the eight offices every hour on the hour, or every two hours until completion. Remember, this is God's time and it ought not to be burdensome.

At the Center, we observe "holy silence" between the "Hours" [except during mealtime] and observe the Night Hours at the prescribed times in this booklet. But we suggest that you adapt these exercises to the needs of your household.

The Eucharist: If a celebrant cannot be present, we suggest that you silently reflect on how *every* meal can become sacramental.

The liturgies are to be read back and forth [Community Right & Community Left]. Two or three participants are sufficient to keep these services in motion.

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## DAY ONE
